Current events

We were just about to begin writing you an Easter card when everything changed. Because of the current situation we are sending this letter by email only. Restrictions on our lives seem to change almost daily. For some these restrictions are simply inconvenient. For others they're scary. Even though the spread of the virus may seem out of control, God remains in control. The theme of our staff conference was well-timed.

A Christian World View

This was the main subject of our annual gathering in the February holidays – the one time each year we all get together. Around 100 of us (including kids) descended on a holiday village in the Ardèche region of southern France.

We were quick to realise just how important our world view is. It's the lens through which we see and interpret reality. A world view provides the answers to these questions: Who am I? Where am I? What is the problem? What is the solution? Our world view is part of our culture: most of the time we don't even realise it's there but it affects everything. We were challenged by the idea of a "dualist" world view where things are divided into 2 opposites: holy and secular, Christian and non-Christian, inside (the church) and outside, spiritual and material. But this dualism finds its roots in Greek philosophy. A view our speakers felt is more in line with scripture could be summarised as: creation, fall, redemption, final completion. To unpack that a bit: God created the universe and people good. Then the fall happened, which marked or stained everything but did not entirely ruin mankind or the world. Mankind and the world are of course still in need of redemption which was accomplished by Christ on the cross, and final completion will come at Christ's return. A dualist worldview tends to focus mainly on fall and redemption, sometimes underemphasizing the good that still remains in the world. We had very interesting discussions in our small groups.

Each year we recognise staff for their years of faithful service, but this time we had a very special one for *Claude & Katia Billard*. They are already semi-retired and this was their last national staff conference. Claude has been in ministry over 40 years and has worked with students, in HR and has run operations. And we have lots of personal history together. Claude and I shared an apartment, along with another staff guy, when I first arrived in France. My French vocabulary greatly increased thanks to Claude, in particular when I was a passenger in his car... Claude was



my best man, and gave one of the funniest best man speeches I've heard – in English no less! I also had the privilege of being his best man, and Claude & Katia looked after Paul several times when he was small. For years we worked side-by-side with Claude & Katia at the office. They will be greatly missed.
