- We will not include personal email, postal addresses, and telephone or fax numbers.
- We may use group images with very general labels e.g. 'making Christmas decorations'.
- We will only use images of people who are suitably dressed to reduce the risk of such images being used inappropriately. e.g. we will not publish material from the youth group's swimming activity.
